Employment of a Sports Apprentice – Ross Irving	£6245	Sports apprentice has assisted with the delivery of PE lessons impacting attainment in lessons. Ross supported less able pupils to improve their fundamental skills and also helped improve lesson participation. He supported some extra-curricular clubs enabling increased numbers and higher quality provision. We had 74% of pupils attending an extra-curricular sports club in KS2 and % in KS1. Furthermore, he supported our Play Pals at lunchtime increasing the provision of additional informal sport and activity.	This was a very beneficial programme to be part of and we will invest in another apprentice in September 2016.
